


#### THREE MORE L.A. MILLER DIARIES

January 10: Somerville (Ohio) bank robbed.



January 21: Death of Mr. Nathan Flenner

January 27: Death of Mrs. William Stumpf

March 31: Death of Mrs. Elizabeth (Nichol) Snyder

April 5: Progress made on re-building the Bufler camp, south of Darrtown.

April 27: Unexpected death of Mr. Guiney, minister of Darrtown Lutheran church

July 7: Milk truck, owned and operated by Mr. Uhl, of Darrtown, struck by train.

August 26: Effort underway to retain the services of the Collinsville station on the Penn RR line.

September 9: Collinsville RR station retained!

September 10: Thieves strike two Darrtown area farmers.

January 13: Darrtown skating rink building burned to ground.

January 20: Meeting held at Darrtown school building to organize a "Darrtown Fire Protection Association."



February 4: Reference made to dances being held at the K of P Hall, as fund-raisers for the K of P lodge.

April 26: Auto takes out telephone pole near Davis' Corner.

June 21 through August 9:

EXTREME HEAT

50 consecutive days

of temperatures

between 88 and

100 degrees.



July 4: Death of Mr. George Bowman.

July 29: Death of Mr. Frank Glardon; sun stoke.

August 14: Severe hail storm north of Darrtown; from Oxford to Middletown (Ohio).

August 26: Seven Mile man reported missing.

August 28: Seven Mile man's body found; foul play suspected.

October 9: Reference to Mr. J. Francis opening a new gasoline station in Darrtown.

December 10: Local farmer, again, victimized by thieves.

### FROM THE MILLER DIARIES...

1932

January 4: Stealing and robbing goes on, as usual. A local bank at Trenton, Ohio, I hear, has failed.

January 13: Decision needed about funds collected for the Darrtown Fire Association.



January 30: Information provided about the origin/creation of the Darrtown K of P lodge.

March 4: Lindberg baby reported kidnapped.

March 6: Thieves hit local farmer - again.

June 3: Miller family, like others of this age, acquire new "refrigerator" - which, in reality, was an "ice box."



May 6: World War I veterans begin gathering in nation's capitol, in quest to receive bonuses that are scheduled to be paid in 1945.

July 28: 15,000 or more "bonus" ex-soldiers routed in dark of night, by US Army regulars, upon order of President Hoover and under the leadership of Gen. MacArthur.



October 14: Darrtown Pike being re-surfaced; reported to have been a toll road that was originally financed by stockholders and eventually purchased by the county commissioners.


