This newsletter describes new content that has been added to the Darrtown website.

Two Family Pages have been added... the CLEMENTS family and the WILLS family.

Until recently, persons associated with this website were unaware of any connection between Darrtown and the Clements family. Then, some **happenstance research** led to the discovery of an 1890 death notice for a Mrs. Clements who was reported as "an old resident of Darrtown."

It was later discovered that a connection existed between the Clement family and the Watt family and the Nichol family and that the Clement name appears in the list of former Darrtown postmasters.



The Wills family page was developed in the more typical manner; which occurs when a family member contributes family information. In this instance, William Granville Wills Jr. offered to share some family history and photos. Bill's contributions include images of the Wills farm, which was located east of Darrtown, on the north side of Scott Road.

Ownership Records

Genealogists and others, who relish researching history about Butler County



(Ohio) families, now have online access to public records maintained by the Butler County Recorder's office. Locating such information in the past required a trip to the county offices; but, now, it is possible to conduct research online to locate records of land ownership going back to the early 1800s.

Darrtown native, Marvin Russell alerted the Darrtown webmaster to the Internet availability of the public records and that led to the addition of the following **three new features** to the website (all three are housed in the Research section of the website).

- 1. A "Step-by-step guide to determining property ownership in Butler County, Ohio."
- 2. An "Explanation of terms used in identifying township properties."
- 3. A direct link to the Butler County Recorder's website.

To access the free and public records, start with:


