This Darrtown.com webpage provides heretofore unknown information about the August 5, 1944 World War II flight from England to Germany that led to the death of Darrtown native, S.Sgt. Donald T. McVicker.

I have attached the final version of the text file (minus the images) that will be used to publish the story of the Langenfeld crew (Donald's aircraft captain)

Before you read the story, I must tell you that given the available documentation and despite tracking down previously unknown and unpublished reports and stories, together with our best efforts (including the 467th Bombardment Group) we have not been able to precisely determine how Donald perished.

I shall leave it for you and the family to decide if the story brings any closure. Be assured that efforts will continue to try and resolve the outstanding identifications.
